



## **KNITTING FOR LIFE**

Knitting, an activity that people can continue to enjoy as they age, may help to reduce depression and anxiety as well as chronic pain, according to a British report.

"There is an enormous amount of research showing that knitting has physical and mental health benefits,



combats depression and distracts from chronic pain. It is an activity that can be continued into (our senior years)," the report stated. "It is a sociable activity that helps overcome isolation and loneliness, too often a feature of old age. It is a skill that can continue when sight and strength are diminished."

Research also suggests that the constant, soothing motion of needle art can enhance the release of Serotonin. The meditativelike qualities produced through knitting can help ease mental and physical struggles for a period of time on a day-to-day basis.

There may even be a link between knitting and addressing addictive behaviors. One survey participant explained that knitting helped her to stop smoking and lose weight. "(It) keeps hands busy, so I'm not snacking in the evenings when watching TV. I dropped two dress sizes in my first year of knitting. It was also a useful aid in helping to stop me smoking, and I think knitting would help more addictions generally," HuffPost U.K. reported.








## **CELEBRATING LOVE**

**Excerpted from Activity Connections** 

Valentine's Day has been celebrated in February for more than 1,500 years. It may have been placed in February to commemorate the anniversary of Valentine's death, or it may have been placed to replace the Roman celebration of Lupercalia, a rowdy celebration of fertility and planting.



Lupercalia dates all the way back to the founding of Rome. According to

folklore, Rome was founded by Romulus and Remus, twin nephews of an ancient king who ordered the small boys drowned. But a servant took pity on them and instead placed them in a water-tight basket in the river, where they were carried downstream and became caught in a wild fig tree.

A she-wolf found and cared for them in a cave at the base of Palatine Hill, where Rome was founded. The boys named the cave Lupercal, and the celebration of Lupercalia was meant to honor the she-wolf and the god Lupercus, who was the god of farmers, harvest, and packs of animals.

Like festivals of other ancient religions, including Judaism, the Lupercalia celebration began with a ritual sacrifice. In this case, a goat and a dog were sacrificed to the god Lupercus. Next, two priests' foreheads were smeared with sacrificial blood, and then they were wiped clean with a cloth soaked in milk. After this, the feasting began. Legend has it that another part of the festival celebration included a temporary "coupling," in which single men would draw a name of a single woman from the jar, and these couples were considered "married" until the end of the festival. Some of them stayed together until the start of the following year's festival. And some fell in love and actually got married!
