





THE WORLD OF EASTER

Excerpted from Activity Connections

Easter is celebrated around the world on different dates each year, and various cultures celebrate the holiday in their own ways.



Guatemala

Antigua, Guatemala, is home to

the world's largest Easter festival. Lasting an entire week, the festival includes elaborate parades, complete with massive floats decorated with religious scenes that travel throughout the city.

France

In France, rather than keeping an eye out for Peter Cottontail, French children are looking for flying bells. The tradition of the bells stems from the silencing of the local church bells from the Thursday before Easter to Easter Sunday, which is done to honor the death of Jesus. The resumption of the ringing bells on Easter coincides with egg hunts for chocolate and sugar eggs that children collect.

Bermuda

On the island of Bermuda, colorful, homemade kites fill the sky and tables are laden with delicious hot cross buns and codfish cakes for Easter. However, don't eat hot cross buns on Good Friday, as legend has it that your house will burn to the ground if you do.

Ukraine and Hungary

The countries of Ukraine and Hungary are famous for their hand-painted, vibrantly colorful, delicate, intricately patterned Easter eggs made with an ancient wax-working technique.

Sweden

Children wear costumes on Easter, similar to how American kids dress up for Halloween. The festivities also include decorating with colorful feathers and feasting with a smorgasbord laden with eggs.
